Teaming up with the songwriting team of Benj Pasek and Justin Paul, the show premiered in September 2010, Goodspeed Musicals in Connecticut. It was later re-worked in 2015 and a new cast album released.

James and the Giant Peach is a delightfully offbeat adaptation of the classic Roald Dahl adventure! When James is sent by his aunts to chop down their old fruit tree, he discovers a magic potion that launches an expedition of enormous proportions. Suddenly, James finds himself in the center of a gigantic peach, among human-sized insects with equally oversized personalities. After the peach rolls into the ocean, the group faces hunger, sharks and plenty of disagreements. Thanks to James' quick wit and creative thinking, they learn to live and work together as a family.



From the Director

A little nonsense now and then is relished by the wisest men.

Roald Dahl's children's books are mostly made up of quirky stories of adventure but they also contain deeper, valuable lessons and *James and the Giant Peach* is no exception — a young person is set against incredible odds, and must find new ways of moving forward to create a new life for himself. The musical version differs from the book, but both share the same storyline and main characters. At its heart, it is a story about the importance of courage, friendship and the true meaning of family.

Live theatre has remarkable power. Its intimacy and emotional honesty can transport us to remarkable places and change how we see ourselves and the larger world around us. My hope is that by bringing James and the Giant Peach to our stage, you might tap into its deeper meanings and understand that you are never alone. Try to recognize the loving ladybugs, gentle grasshoppers and sagacious spiders who come into your life in unexpected ways. And if you encounter a frightened earthworm along life's journey, help them to find their bravery and in doing so find your own. When encountering cynical centipedes (as we most assuredly will at some point), step back and try and understand the reasons for their feelings and attitudes (walk a mile in their many, many shoes) and in doing so we will hopefully learn more about ourselves. "And above all, watch with glittering eyes the whole world around you because the greatest secrets are always hidden in the most unlikely places. Those who don't believe in magic will never find it." — Roald Dahl
